Our goals: The School Advisory Committee of the Geilenkirchen Elementary School will support the school's CSP goal of helping every student to improve reading comprehension across the curriculum and to achieve at the highest level possible by:

1. Minutes of meeting, 12 February, 2008 were approved as submitted.

2. Reports by individuals

A. Principal reported on:

1) There is still no SLO at this time. Maj M-B. is the POC.

2) Budget- The budget will be cut again. The UFR's are still pending. Monies reserved for future supplies; paper, toner etc. .

4) Five Year Plan- Renovations-These projects have been identified and are in the Isles DSO listing for funding. An allocation will be determined by the Isles DSO later in the year. The playground will be repaired over the summer.

Repair the fire alarm, renovate Bldg. 109 Art/ Music rooms, classroom lighting, safety tiles on the playground, exterior painting of the buildings, handicap ramp at front entrance, covered walkways between buildings. All smart boards will be up, projectors will be up by fall.

5) Staffing- Will remain the same for the 2008-2009 school year. The Special Ed Aide's hours will be expanded to include General Ed Aide duties.

6) End of Year Activities- Dare graduation, Dietician visit, PTSO reception, AFN Band, GK recital, Sports Day, Young Authors Tea, Pool party, Awards Ceremony, Sixth grade promotion

B) New Business- The next SAC meeting will be 16 Sept, 2008. New parent representative is L.C. and the new teacher representative is C.B., who volunteered to take the minutes. The 08-09 school year calendar is approved an online. The first day of school is August 19 for 1-6.

Substitute Orientation/Training- Per Principal, ET will be recruited to conduct Smart Board training for substitute teachers. This will allow continuation of the students' lessons during teacher absences. An orientation plan will be implemented for the new substitutes.

Improving Critical Thinking for the students is an ongoing objective for the next four years.
